It has taken a few years, but Tolaini seems to hittings its stride with a set of beautiful and differentiated wines. Initially Tolaini focused on international varieties, but Sangiovese simply can't be denied, especially in a place as privileged as Castelnuovo Berardenga. As always, the Tolaini wines lean towards the rich, full-bodied end of the spectrum.
